Charles Hastings Housing Co-op has passed the Refugee by-law prepared by Bruce Lewis. The by-law was passed at the January 19 members' meeting. Co-ops who have frequent vacancies will not need to pass this by-law.

City administered co-ops will not be able to provide rent supplements. Before proceeding on market units, check with your social housing consultant.
